

PAPERWORK YOU MUST HAVE FOR THE FAIR!!!

- Heifers must have a health certificate and TB test from the vet to participate at the Bi-County Fair. This is a new state rule and mandatory!
- Sheep or goats traveling to the fair from out of the McKinley and Cibola County district need a health certificate to participate at the Bi-County fair. All Sheep and Goats must have a scrapies tag.
- Sheep, pigs, or goats purchased from out of state must have a health certificate to participate at the Bi-County Fair
- All animals must be accompanied by a bill of sale upon arrival to check-in. Home grown animals must be accompanied by a brand card – this includes cattle and sheep.
- Rabbits must be tattooed before or during check-in to show at the fair
- Chickens must be banded before or during check-in to show at the fair
- Remember to bring your camping passes, it's the only way the manger knows you bought a camping spot
- All 4-H indoor project entries must be **paid in cash**, NO CHECKS EXCEPTED
- **Participants in rabbits and chickens need to feed and care for their own animals**
- Don't forget livestock check-in is Thursday, August 28, 2009 from 12:00pm to 7:00 pm
- THERE IS A **MANDATORY** LIVESTOCK EXHIBITION MEETING ON Thursday, August 28, 2008 @ 7:30pm

Animals must be checked out at the fair office by 10:00 a.m. on Monday, Sept. 1, 2008
